

My No. 1 issue is safe and clean streets. That is the foundation of quality of life in District 2. If residents don't feel safe walking to school and work, shopping on our commercial corridors, or coming home at night, nothing else matters. It also directly impacts our local businesses. When streets feel unsafe or dirty, customers stop coming and local shops suffer.

As Supervisor, I will focus on visible enforcement and real accountability when the law is broken. I will increase policing in our neighborhoods and foot patrols on our commercial corridors, push for faster response times, and crack down on repeat offenders and illegal activity.

Clean streets go hand-in-hand with safe streets. Graffiti, trash, illegal dumping, and neglected sidewalks send the message that no one is in charge, and it invites more crime and disorder. I will push for graffiti removal with faster response-time standards, expand sidewalk power washing and trash pickup, improve lighting in problem areas, and ensure Public Works has consistent cleaning schedules and follow-through.

District 2 deserves a city that works, safe and clean streets that support residents and businesses will be my daily focus.
