What's a place in District 4 that has been neglected? If elected, what are you going to do to fix it?

Sunset Boulevard is a vital artery in District 4 that has been neglected regarding basic infrastructure and safety. Here are three things I would do:

- 1. Fixing Dangerous Drainage Hazards:** On rainy days, severe drainage issues cause water to pool and build up in several spots along Sunset Boulevard. This can be dangerous because it creates severe hydroplaning risks for drivers and also damages our roads and streets over time. As Supervisor, I would work with PUC, MTA, and DPW to clear, repair, and fix these drainage hazards.
- 2. Improving Pedestrian Safety:** The intersections at the north end near Lincoln Way and the south end near Sloat Boulevard are incredibly dangerous for pedestrians. Cars are speeding through the sweeping slip lanes, and at night, visibility is dangerously low. As Supervisor, I would work with SFMTA and DPW on brightening up those walkable paths and also adding a pedestrian caution light to make our streets safer for everyone.
- 3. Funding a Dedicated Green Team:** We need a dedicated green team to manage median green space on Sunset Boulevard from Lincoln Way down to Ortega. If you go there now, the green space is overgrown and poorly maintained. I would advocate for a budget for Recreation and Parks to work alongside neighbors to help maintain, clean, and beautify this greenway.
