SF spent decades building new housing in only a few neighborhoods while the north and west sides built almost nothing. The result: a city with not enough homes for workers, families, seniors, and young people. Family Zoning is a correction to that.

It will also create thousands of jobs for our construction workforce, using registered labor apprenticeship programs to train the next generation of young people to quickly build new homes. We have to say yes to housing at every level, from permanent supportive housing to market rate. I support rent control and oppose demolishing rent-controlled housing, so I would also have backed the tenant protections in the final plan.
